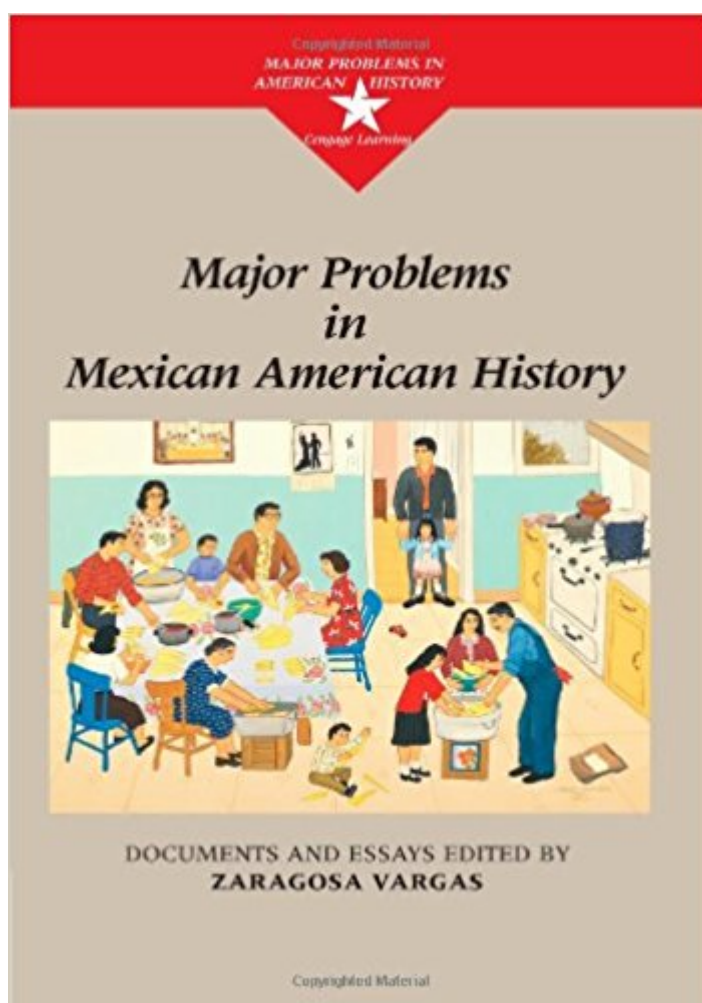


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Major Problems In Mexican American History (Major Problems In American History Series)
