

This story may not be for everyone. It is about a boy lost in the darker side of what can be- a victim. And it's touching and real. And so well written. What a great journey.

This is an exceptionally difficult book to review because the story is heartbreaking and how do you rate a tragedy? This review is of the writing. I felt that the story line was very stereotypical and superficial. Very little was portrayed in any depth. The events were described and but not explored so I felt distanced from the situation as I would reading a brief newspaper article. This was most evident in Steven's friendships which felt like just by the way I know these two people not like friends who would have more intimate knowledge of each other. As there was little depth to their friendship any romance came across as false. @crushingcinders

The concept of the story was very good, but there was no character development at all. I never felt like I knew Stephen or any of the other characters as well. We weren't really shown any real emotion, except for Stephen getting in a few fights. It seemed like all that happened was he didn't want to go home; he went anyway; and showed up the next day beat up. His "friends" didn't seem to care about him much either. I really wanted to like this book, but it had no depth. It read as a summary description, not a real story.
