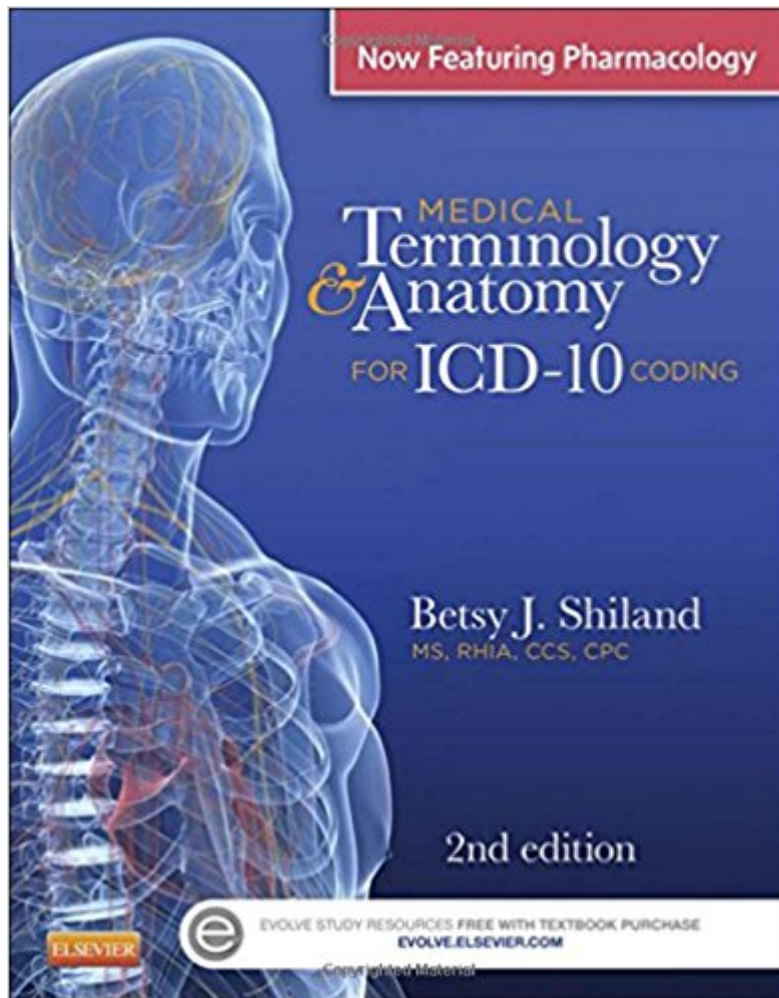

Excellent book for first-time coders/non-clinical coders. Not so much for straight A&P, as I don't think it's probably specific enough and the (plentiful) illustrations are not quite detailed enough. BUT it is specifically for ICD-10, and it's great for that. The online study resources are great and I use them daily. Would definitely recommend.

I'm only 2% into the book and I really liked it up until I came to Exercise 1. It has a small box to practice matching healthcare terms but you can't read it nor can you enlarge it. (I own a paper white kindle and I don't know if the device makes a difference) as you get farther into the chapter there is another boxed list showing Noun-Endings Suffixes and it's the same thing can't read it. Print is too light and tiny and you can't enlarge it! I gave it 2 stars because I am having trouble overlooking this part but I do like what I have read so far.

Huge amount of information covered, with focus on break down of word roots, suffixes, etc, to really help you to understand the terms, rather than just memorizing them.
