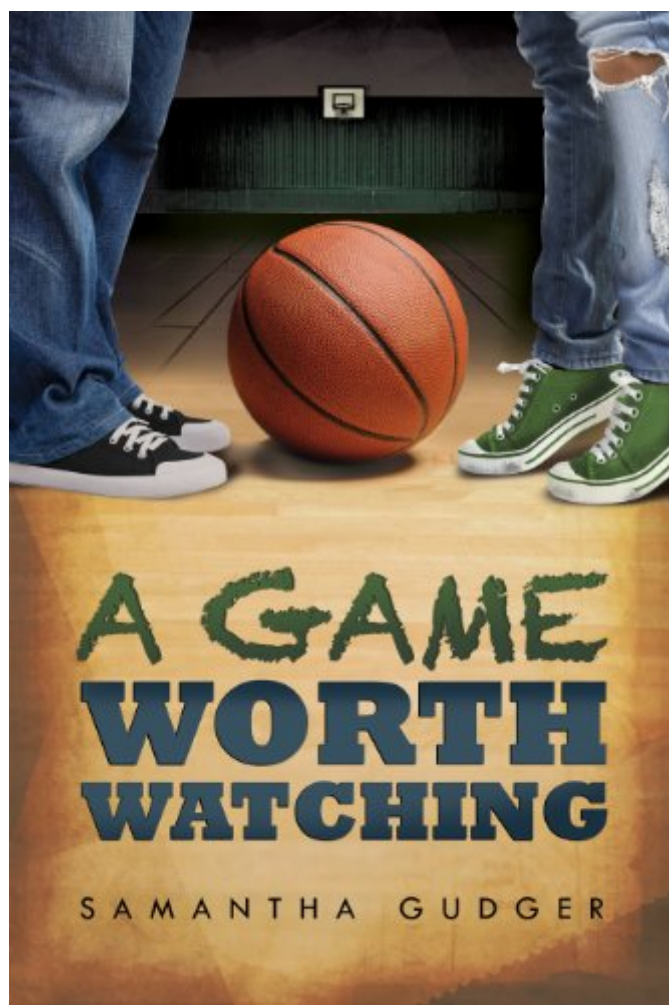


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A Game Worth Watching (Worth Series Book 1)

As an avid book reader, especially teen books, there are many things that draw me into the story. The main thing that makes me LOVE to read are the characters. To be honest I was a bit hesitant to read this story to begin with as I am not a basketball player or a fan of basketball. I picked it up anyway based on the synopsis of the story and I was not disappointed. This book has a great group of characters that I fell in love with. The story is filled with strong characters, which make you laugh,

I had the privilege of beta reading for Samantha Gudger's *A Game Worth Watching* and when I first agreed to read it, never did I think I would get sucked into such a great story. It is a book geared towards a younger crowd but really hits such a broad range of readers. It has basketball in it, a lot of basketball...but don't let that scare you away! The basketball scenes are really written in such a way that you can see in your mind all of the moves and you find yourself really cheering on the players. Every girl wants, heck NEEDS a best friend like Riley. He is Emma's rock. He is so supportive, willing to drop everything to be there for Emma. He is such a strong force in Emma's life, you can't help but fall in love with him and I found myself waiting for their relationship to become more than just a friendship. When Emma is asked to join the girls basketball team, you really have to admire her for sticking with a group of

girls who hate her and treat her horribly. She fights any and all change that is presented and it is fun to watch her resolve to be the tough guy disintegrate forcing her to face her fears and for once, really get to know herself. Samantha Gudger really knows how to write a book that makes you truly feel something. I laughed, I got angry and I cried and was definitely left wanting more. Not into YA or sports books?
