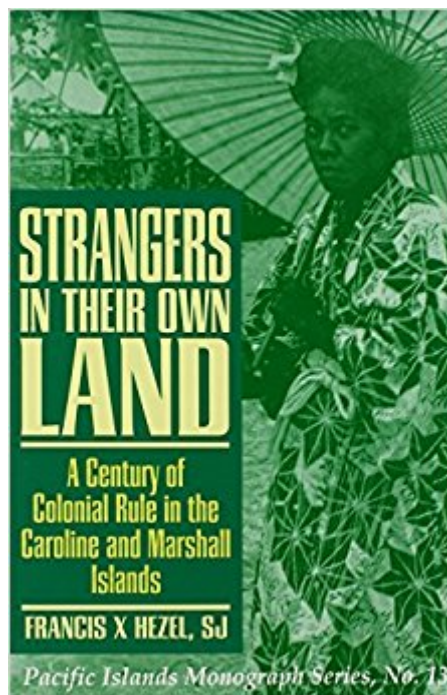




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Strangers In Their Own Land: A Century Of Colonial Rule In The Caroline And Marshall Islands (Pacific Islands Monographs Series)
