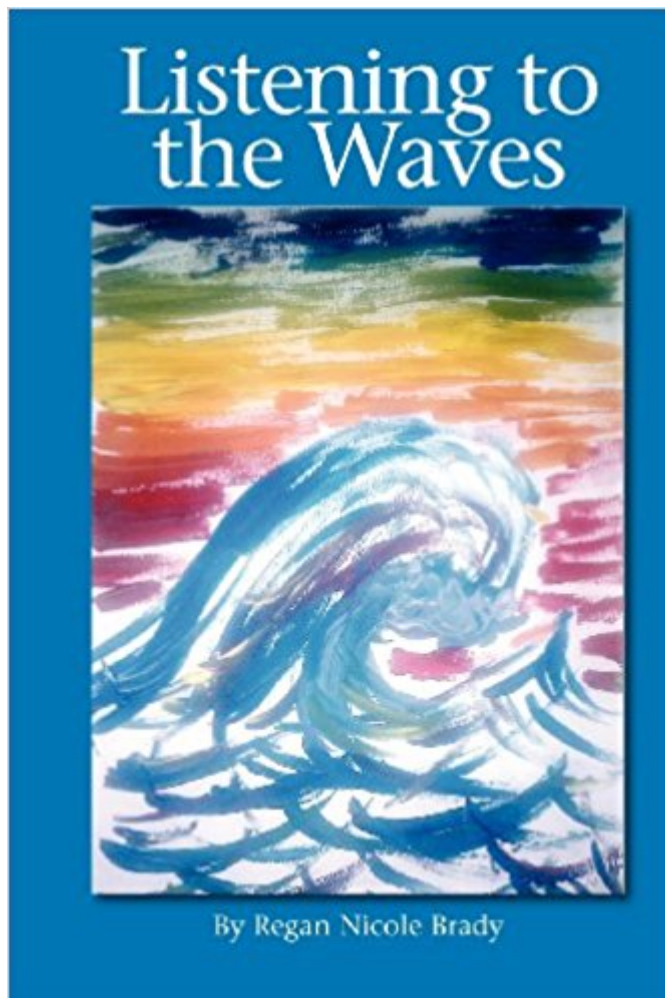




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Listening To The Waves

Regan lives in Shaker Heights, Ohio and is a graduate of Auditory Verbal therapy. She recieved her first implant at 20 months of age and her second at 7 1/2. An active member of school and her community, she intends to continue to advocating for hearing impaired individuals and their families.

I wanted to update my review based on giving this book to my daughter. I didn't even wrap the book for her birthday, I gave it to her a few days later, and I am so glad I did! She is really enjoying the story. Unlike the (deaf) girl who wrote the book, my daughter has a rare form of hearing loss (EVA) and it took years to receive a diagnosis. At one point, I was told that I was acting as if I wanted there to be a loss. Our journey was very different, but as my daughter is reading this book she is learning, asking lots of questions, and isn't so alone in her hearing loss. I can't recommend this book enough. My daughter is 11 yrs old, this book is for a child that enjoys reading chapter books. My first review was rated lower because I expected a children's story- a story book, instead it's a child's personal journey.

This is a fantastic book for anyone with a hearing impaired child. While most often information is told

by parents or medical personnel, this book is told by the child herself. You truly get good information from the child's perspective.
