

The book pictured is not the book shipped. The book when I clicked the order sent to another book entirely. However if I look up the ISBN number of the book I searched for, a different book comes up altogether. When attempting to purchase the correct book, the new book defaults back to the one I already ordered, that again, was not the book pictured. When you choose the "look inside" option, the book presented is not the book shipped at all. The contents are entirely different, the introduction and foreword are entirely different. Do not buy this book here. Buy it from local

bookstores to avoid the hassle.

Once in a while, there comes a writer with the rare ability to make one feel as if they never really understood the world in the first place. Ralph Waldo Emerson was one such writer. A philosopher, lecturer and poet all wrapped up in one, Emerson displays the power of this unique blend in his immortal essays. Emerson combines his incredible understanding of life with his equally strong command of the English language in order to delineate the various topics discussed in his work. Without going into too much detail (as it would greatly deprive prospective readers the pleasure of reading these essays for themselves), I would like to share a few pearls of wisdom taken from this book. In one of his most famed essays, *Self-Reliance*, Emerson states: "He who knows that power is inborn, that he is weak because he has looked for good out of him and elsewhere, and so perceiving throws himself unhesitatingly on his thought, instantly rights himself, stands in the erect position, commands his limbs, works miracles; just as a man who stands on his feet is stronger than a man who stands on his head." In *Compensation*, Emerson states: "Our strength grows out of our weakness. The indignation which arms itself with secret forces does not awaken until we are pricked and stung and sorely assailed. A great man is always willing to be little. While he sits on the cushion of advantages, he goes to sleep. When he is pushed, tormented, defeated, he has a chance to learn something; he has been put on his wits, on his manhood; he has gained facts; learns his ignorance; is cured of the insanity of conceit; has got moderation and real skill..." And in *The Over-Soul*, Emerson writes: "The soul is the perceiver and revealer of truth. We know truth when we see it, let skeptic and scoffer say what they choose. Foolish people ask you, when you have spoken what they do not wish to hear, 'How do you know it is truth and not an error of your own?' We know truth when we see it, from opinion, as we know when we are awake that we are awake..." I could go on and on about the many other great statements in this book, but the message is clear. This is highly recommended reading for anyone with an interest in philosophy and spirituality.

There are very few writers who have ever imparted more wisdom in so few words. If Thomas Jefferson is the spirit of America then Ralph Waldo Emerson was its soul. A person who reads the words of Emerson cannot help but be haunted by the feeling of an eternal season of spring infused with the eternal sadness of life's inevitable end. Emerson is required reading for all thoughtful men and women. This particular book is excellent and no one looking to purchase Emerson's work in the Kindle format should hesitate to purchase it.

The essay "Self Reliance" has been in my heart for decades. You cannot go wrong with RWE.

I once read that reading any one of Emerson's essay can pull you out of a nervous breakdown. The guy's optimism is amazing; I tend to turn to him when I need a pick-me-up. The Library of America craftsmanship is, as always, excellent.

They are beautifully bound in various colors of fabric (uniform colored dust covers) with matching ribbon book mark. The binding is solid and durable. The collections within each volume are logical, complimentary, and often comprehensive of a particular author's type of work (e.g. collected poems, essays). These original works were written in english, so translation is not an issue. Editing has been accurate.
