

At first glance, Lizzy doesn't seem like the kind of character that can hold a book all on her own. I kept picturing Miley Cyrus pre-twerking phase. That is until you see the former child star thrust into some very adult situations and finding solace in the arms of the last person she expects to--the sexy personal trainer that lives to tease her about her past. The more I learned about Lizzy and saw who she was at her core, behind the scenes, the more I began to love her and root for her. Handsome personal trainer Devon is tempting and complicated, confounding Lizzie after almost every encounter. After a lifetime of working on the stage, Lizzie learns how tough life can get when a director isn't yelling cut and the cameras aren't fading to black. I loved watching their relationship mature as they did and my heart broke and soared right along with theirs! This is a sweet New Adult read that I would recommend to anyone!

The story pulls you in immediately and entertains to the end. "A Safe Space" is about famous former child actress Lizzie Warner, who feels lost and alone in the world now that she is an adult. She is trying her best to find her way in life and in love. Lizzie is a sweet ingenue, despite having worked in show biz. She is also irresistibly attracted to Devon, the gorgeous, self assured personal trainer at her gym, who tosses women aside weekly (sometimes in front of Lizzie) and always seems to have a snarky comment handy for Lizzie. But, things are not always what they seem and the storyline

delivers more than just a romance as Lizzie is also involved in a lot of charity work for children in need of donors. With the help of Devon and Kyra (Lizzie's roommate and friend from "Break It Up"), Lizzie learns a lot about friendship, love, heartbreak, and what family should mean and be.
