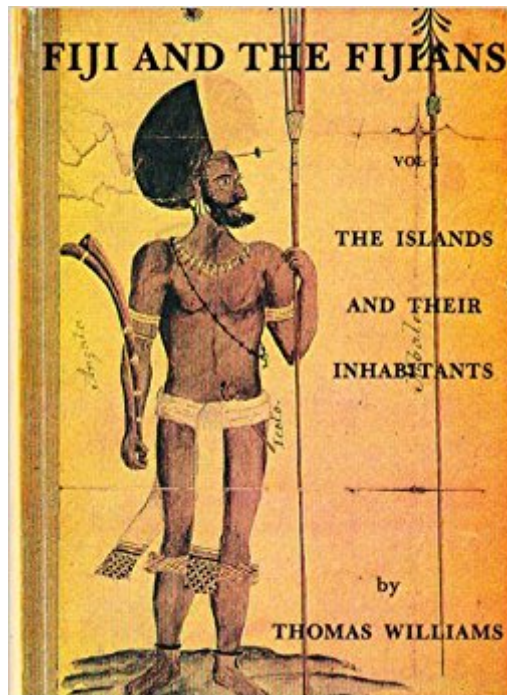


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Fiji And The Fijians: Vol. 1, The Islands And Their Inhabitants



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The Missionaries who have given to these languages a fixed orthography, have wisely adopted the Roman alphabet, and a system of vowels having the Italian power, which met the requirements of the case far better than the almost exceptional sounds of the English vowels. As regards the consonants, the Missionaries found that the Fijian did not require all the characters used by ourselves some of these were therefore rejected, while some were employed where we have recourse to a clumsy combination.
